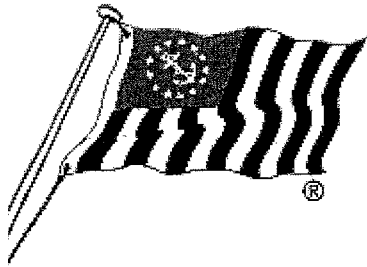

Five squadrons have participated so far this year and it looks like all five will make the squadron honor roll and a few people will make the individual honor roll. There will be a co-op charting session at the spring conference and we hope to have a guest speaker from NOAA Weather with us.
